FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

LISTEN. RESPOND. INNOVATE. GROW.

Along with all the work the team does every day - often 24/7 - with the children, youth and families in our care, 2022 was also a year when we listened. We listened to our partners, engaging dozens of local organizations through an Oregon Health Authority planning grant, participation in the Safe Kids Coalition and Restorative Justice initiatives. We listened to youth and families through one-on-one support and asking simple questions like, "How are you? What do you need? How can we help you to be your very best?" We listened to experts in Trauma Informed Design and Design for Spatial Justice at Harvard University, the University of Oregon and Adre Development. We listened to kids and families that we couldn't help (due to a lack of staff, time or money) by ensuring that we passed them on to one of our partners who could. We also heard that Oregon was emerging from the pandemic with a 49% gap in drug and alcohol treatment services needed by vouth (OHŠU report).

By listening, we responded and innovated. We added new Alcohol & Drug services (see Matt's story), new outpatient treatment, and additional enrichment activities for kids in our care. We advocated for policy changes to make "the system" work better for our clients and we lent our expertise (and a shoulder to cry on) to community partners as they set up their new programs.

We pushed ourselves to think differently about how to respond to the ever changing needs of children and youth in our communities, but still with our vision firmly set on being a regional center of excellence. We will continue to listen, respond, innovate and grow in 2023. Please stick with us on this journey... it's about to get very exciting!

OUR VISION

HELPING CHILDREN, YOUTH & FAMILIES.

Parrott Creek's history is a story of local vision and true community commitment. We were founded in 1968 through a citizen-approved bond levy that purchased a farm house and 80 acres of soul-reviving woodland. We then launched a small "ranch" program to help kids get away from negative influences and avoid incarceration. Over the years we have grown into a robust organization providing a diverse array of services - from early interventions and community support through to outpatient treatment and intensive residential programs.

Our community of donors, friends and local, state and federal partners continue to support our vision to become a regional center of excellence in service to children, youth and families. Together we can ensure all children reach their full and true potential.

OUR PROGRAMS

24 Youth: Lifeguards provides assessment and outpatient treatment services for adolescents who exhibit sexually inappropriate behavior. This program continues to have a 100% success rate with no new sexual offenses for clients who have completed treatment.



206 Parents & 340 Children:
The Children & Mother's Program provides multiple service options, from outreach to support in transitioning families into recovery and stable housing. The STAR Team engaged with 182 parents seeking education and assistance for substance use issues, with 62 successfully entering treatment. We served 15 families in our Recovery Homes, and 9 families accessed housing support through the Home Safe program.





41 Youth: The Ranch and New Era House serve youth in the juvenile justice and child welfare systems, providing counseling, skill building and therapeutic support to help them and their families work together to create stable, safe and nurturing home environments.

 clients reported an average of 32% increase in their overall wellbeing compared to the start of treatment.



 we provided 786 hours of Individual Therapy and 6711 hours of Group Skill Building to residential participants.



7 Young Adults: Molalla House is a five bed independent living program in Oregon City supporting youth aging out of foster care and who could benefit from ongoing nurturing support.



PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT:

DRUG & ALCOHOL PROGRAM.

In response to the dramatically increased need for behavioral healthcare in Oregon, we launched several new services this year, including therapeutic outpatient mental health, substance use disorder treatment, and an Alcohol and Drug Housing Assistance Program (ADHAP).

Matt* is a newly sober young father who reached out to our ADHAP caseworker, Drew, in the summer of 2022. He needed support covering rent while living in transitional, clean and sober housing and continuing his Substance Use Disorder treatment. We provided ADHAP funds so that Matt could get caught up on the outstanding utility bills that were preventing him from obtaining an apartment, helped him with the application process and covered his moving expenses.

By the fall, Matt had moved into a two bedroom apartment and was able to reunite with his 6 year-old daughter and have her live with him again. Matt was also hired on with the property management company to help with onsite maintenance, receiving a stipend for his housing unit.

Matt told Drew that the assistance he received from Parrott Creek allowed him to lay down a stable foundation for his life, rebuild his little family and (re)launch himself into the world.

Every day, we see men and women like Matt working hard to advocate for themselves and maintain sobriety. Our new Alcohol and Drug Housing Assistance Program provides one-to-one support and critically needed funds at a turning point for many people in our community. We were honored to launch this new program with an exceptional staff team to develop it further.

We believe the children and families we serve are smart, capable and doing the best they can with the resources they have available to them at that time. Our job is to help them reach their full potential, open new doors and help change the course of their lives. Our new behavioral health programs and services extend our impact as we respond to the needs of our communities.


